

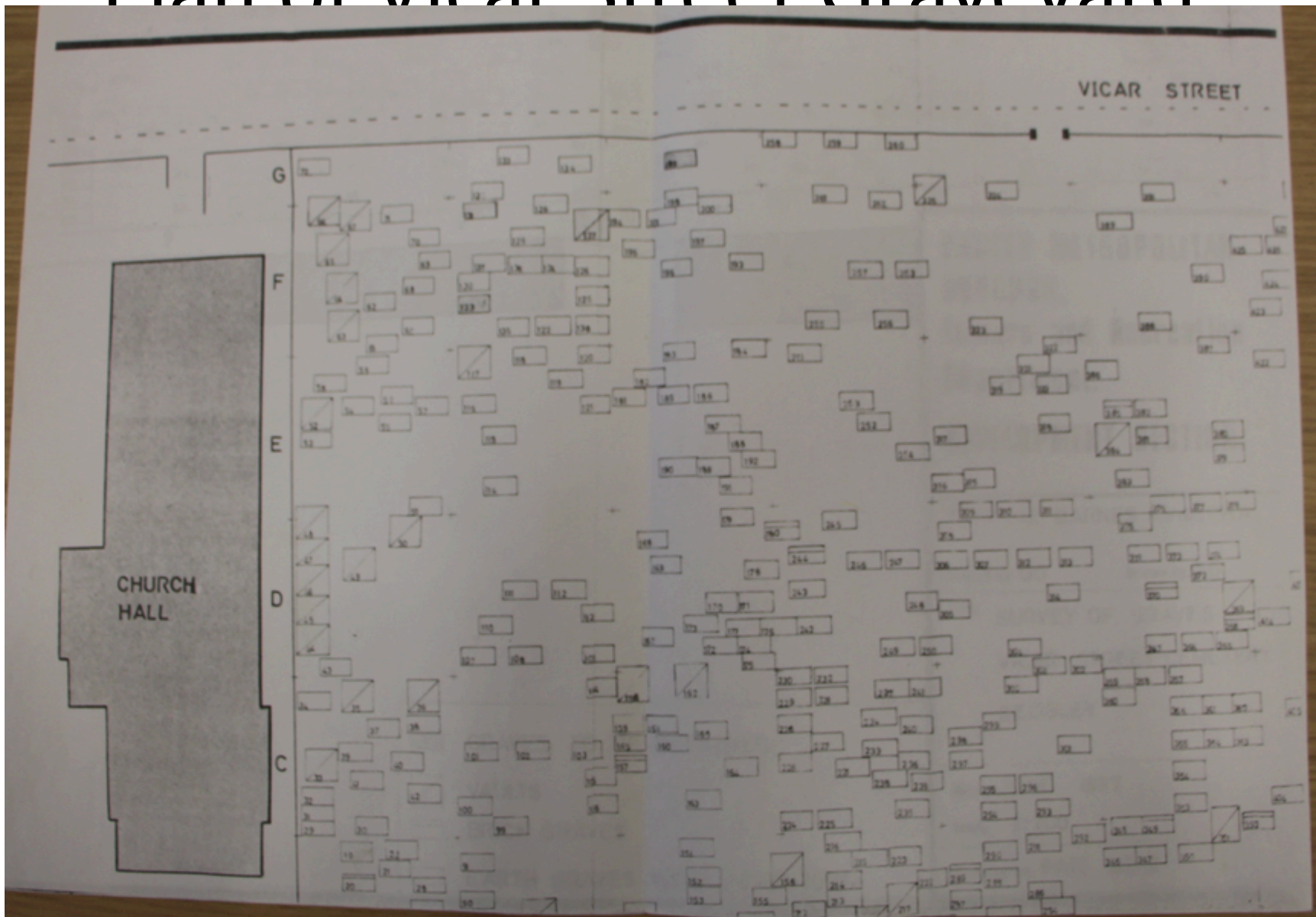

# Ted Cox – Fruiterer and Florist (2)

Rex Burrows posted 29/10/19:

Cox's nursery was originated by my Grandfather in about 1860/1870 and passed on to my Grandmother in circa 1905 .

Prior to starting the nursery he was described in the census returns as a nailer and we're his family members.

The nursery was however operated by my Uncle Walter who had only just finished school when his father died. He was also helped by his sister ( my mother) and the business flourished and expanded to include floristry.

In the course of time Walter's son joined his father and the business became known as 'W. E. Cox and Son, Nurserymen and Seedsmen'.

Floristry was also included, with wreaths and bouquets a speciality.

# Ted Cox – Fruiterer and Florist (2)

- The nursery occupied the land where Avington Grange (Close?) now stands.
- The floristry was run principally from the shop which was situated in the property on the right with the blue door.
- The property on the left (black door, no14) was indeed the original Methodist chapel prior to its move to Tipton street.
- In the family it was known as the warehouse where vegetables from the nursery were kept for retail sale.
- Until the property was sold for housing it still retained the original large arched chapel window.



# Ted Cox Fruiterer and Florist (3)

- When Uncle Walter died Ted continued to run the nursery still helped by my mother, until the landlord sold the land for development.
- Ted continued to sell fruit and veg. from the shop but the passing trade was insufficient to justify carrying on with this.
- However floristry continued with emphasis on wreathes and bouquets. In this he was joined by his daughter Jane, who continued the trade after Ted died. But she did not have any transport and was unable to continue and closed the business.

***Brian Cherrington writes:***

I worked at the Nursery as a Wednesday afternoon job – probably in around 1962. I remember being paid four bob for the afternoon. This was in the days when Dudley Grammar School pupils had the afternoon off but went to school on Saturday mornings!

I did odd jobs for old Mr Cox such as wheeling coke to the three boiler houses which heated the various green houses. Fuel must have been a bit cheaper in those days!

Also working at the nursery were old Mrs Cox, the Cox's son who was probably in his thirties and wife. Also I remember a Mr Borrows and his wife who were probably in their sixties then.

Old Mr Cox who was a lovely old chap, always had a pipe in his mouth died in 1963 or 64 of what was described to me as an enlarged heart, whatever that is.

You asked about the Nursery shop which was on Bush Bank. In your photograph Cox's was the centre of the three shown with steps up to the door which opened into a small shop. Behind the shop was one big open room where they prepared flower arrangements but mainly wreaths. I remember the room had a very high ceiling.

Mr and Mrs Cox also lived there but I cant remember there being any doorways off the big room. Maybe the property was bigger than I remember or they lived in one of the adjoining cottages??

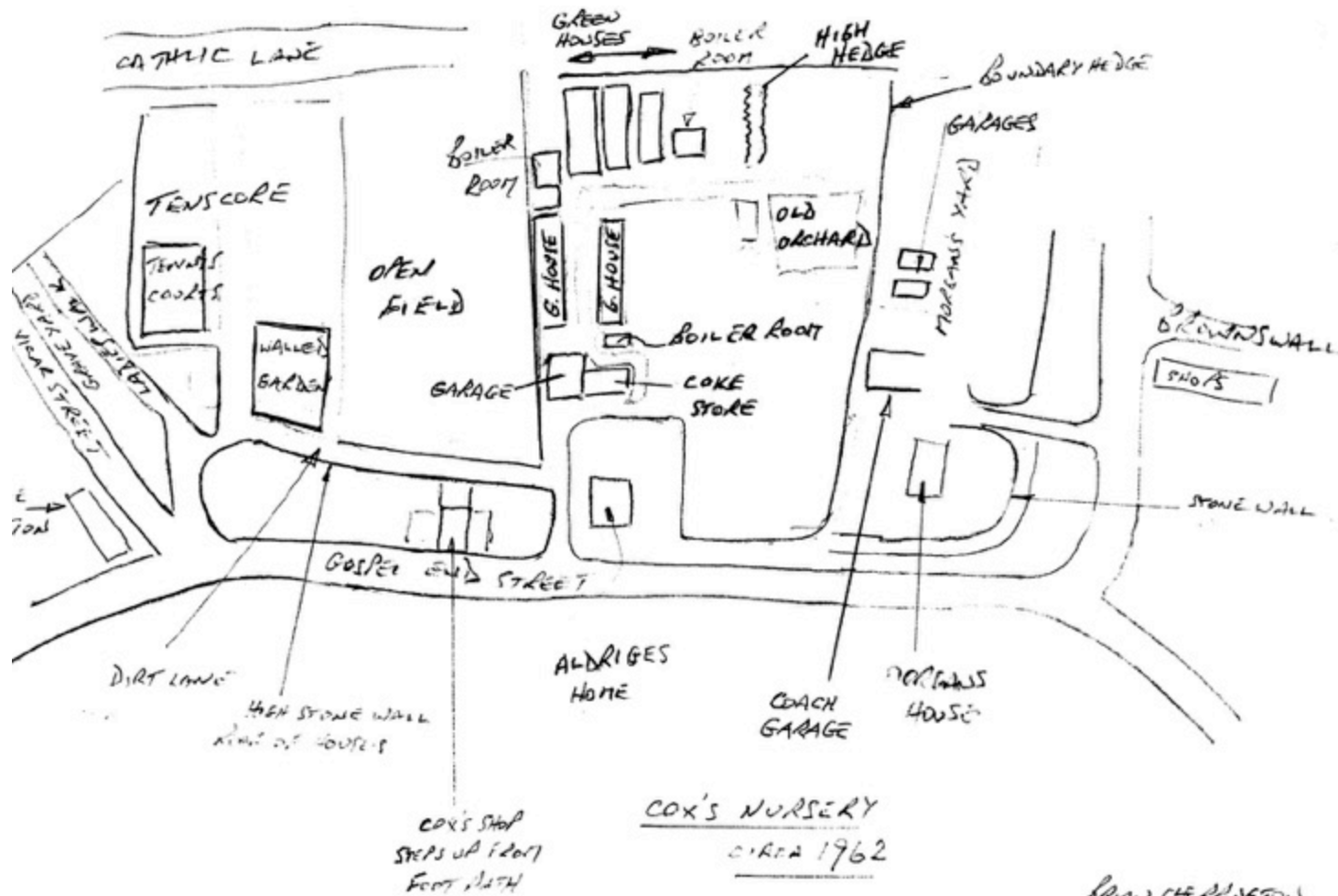
At the rear of the premises was a small garden and at the end a high stone wall with a gate into the lane which ran at the back of the houses on Bush Bank.

The top of the lane which was unmade linked through to Ladies Walk and the Tenscore. From the Cox's gateway 50 yards or so down was the driveway into the Nursery yard with a tin garage (may have been an old Nissen hut) at the side of which was a large coke store used to heat the green houses.

The Nursery had probably six or so large green houses heated by hot water pipes fed from three boiler houses. The Nursery was to the rear of the Morgan premises which had a coach garage and various outbuildings behind the yard.

Morgans also lived on site in a large detached house which fronted onto the road. All of the land for both Morgan's and Cox's are now of course taken up by new housing.

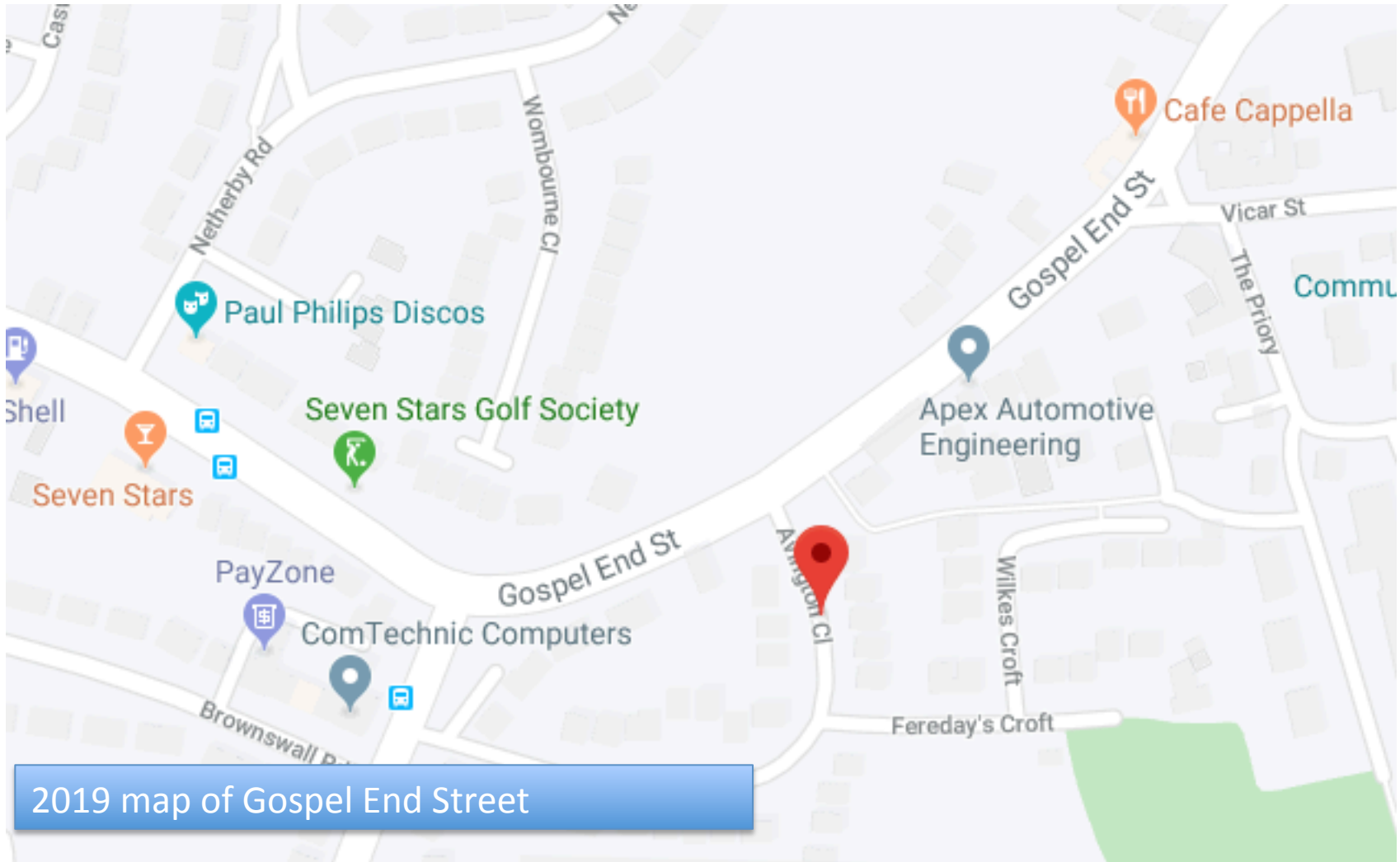

# Stephen Cox - Safe Manufacturer



**Stephen Cox and Son Safemakers** were established in 1890 and located on **Dudley Road**. Stephen Cox not only made **safes** - they also made **iron doors and frames**.

Stephen Cox & Sons Safes provided **fire and burglar-proof safes, fire cabinets and wall safes**.

Some may still be in use.

# Stephen Cox Safe Manufacturer (1)

*Carl Higgs posted 30/10/19:*

- **Stephen Cox** was born 29 Feb. 1864 to parents **Stephen Cox Snr.**, a cordwainer (shoe maker) and Elizabeth, of 67 Chapel Street, Coseley.
- By 1881 the family had moved to **Clarence Street, Upper Gornal**, and **Stephen Jnr.** was already working as an **iron safe maker**, aged 17.
- He had an older brother, **William**, who was a railway clerk, and a younger brother **Alfred**, who was a painter and glazier, as well as sisters **Hannah, Fanny and Lucy**, and another younger



# Stephen Cox Safe Manufacturer (2)

- Stephen married **Elizabeth**, daughter of Joseph Hinton at Sedgley on 13 Apr. 1890 and they went to live at **8 Tipton Street**.
- Stephen was already an iron safe manufacturer and employer in 1891 with an 18 month old son named **Frank Augustus**.
- Also living with them was Stephen's young apprentice **Alfred Hale** from London.
- By **1901** Stephen's family had moved to **51 Dudley Road** - they now had another son, Horace, and a daughter, Ida. Over the next few years Stephen's business grew.

# Stephen Cox Safe Manufacturer (3)

- His two sons **Frank and Horace** came of age and joined the business; two more daughters, Doreen and Henrietta were born, and the family moved into '**Hawthorn Villa**', **141 Dudley Road** (though Stephen and Elizabeth had also lost two children in infancy by 1911).
- **Stephen Cox died 31 Mar. 1939 aged 75 years**, leaving his estate to his widow Elizabeth and his three daughters, Ida Ethelinda (wife of John Whitehouse), Doreen Marjorie (wife of Walter James Hammond), and Henrietta Baxter Worsey

# 1<sup>st</sup> Sedgley Scout Hut – building the original hut



**1st Sedgley Scout Hut** in the 1970s. It was built from scratch on Sunday mornings over a four-year period 1974-77 by dedicated volunteers: **The Sunday Morning Working Club** included **Frank Turner, Wilf Beech, Alan Turner and Lawson Turner**. Up till then the scouts had met in a number of local venues including Queen Victoria School Hall, the old All Saints' Parish hall and Ruiton Windmill (1965). Later, in 1985, an extension was built to act as a group equipment store.

# Squadron Leader Stephen Cox



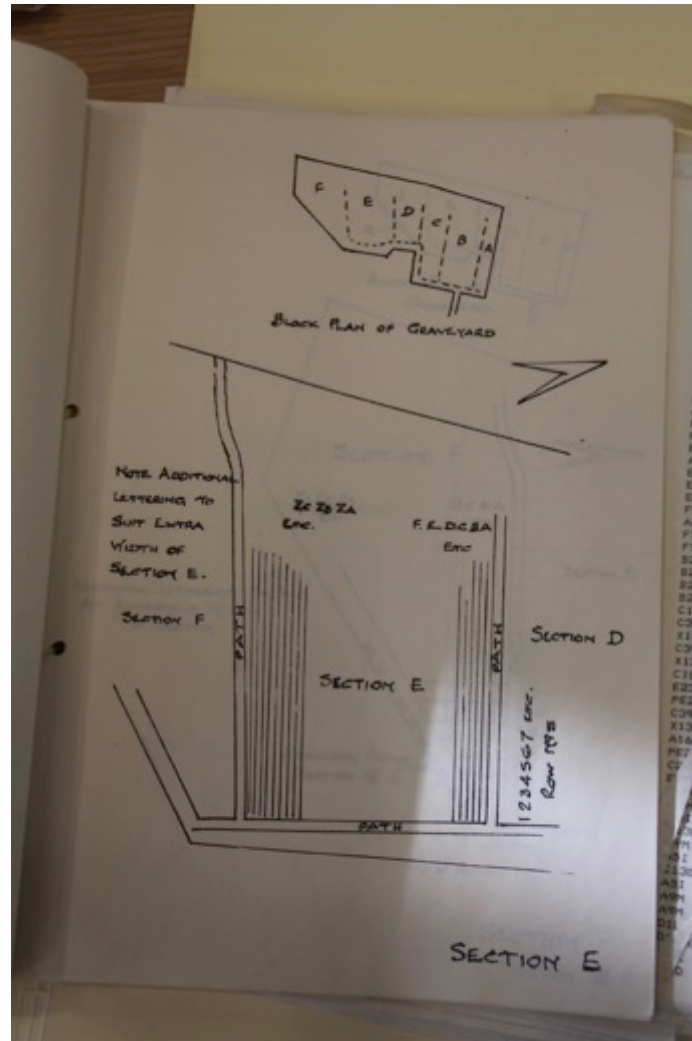
**Squadron Leader Stephen Cox of the Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve**, who survived the Second World War only to die of undiagnosed appendicitis on Christmas Eve in 1945. He was only 28. He's buried in **Gospel End Street graveyard** - his grave, along with other military graves, is maintained by the Commonwealth War Graves Commission.
