

There were two possibilities: Matthias and Joseph Barsabas. What a choice!

RECIPE OF THE MONTH

Cod & Vegetable Bake

Ingredients

50 ml olive oil
4 potatoes thickly sliced
1 crushed garlic clove
4 200 gr cod steaks about 25 mm thick
finely pared rind & juice of a lemon
1 tsp thyme leaves
8 tomatoes halved lengthwise
1 Spanish onion cut into wedges
1 red pepper, cored, deseeded & diced
12 black olives
salt & pepper
thyme sprigs to garnish

Method

Brush a large baking dish with some of the oil

Steam the potatoes for 10 minutes or until tender Remove from heat & turn on to a clean tea towel.

Spread the potatoes in single layer in the baking dish. Sprinkle the garlic over them and season to taste. Lay the cod steaks on top, add the lemon rind & sprinkle with lemon juice. Add the thyme leaves, tomatoes, onion, red pepper & olives.

Bake in a preheated oven, 190 C Gas Mark 5 for twenty minutes or until the fish is cooked. Garnish & serve immediately.

WW1 TIMELINE—EVENTS OF 1916

July	
1st	 Battles of the Somme, 1916, begin with the <u>Battle of</u> <u>Albert (1st—16th).</u> 7.28: Lochnagar Mine Exploded, La Boisselle, France. Contact Patrol, or liaison with infantry, first instituted in The Royal Flying Corps.

7th	British Forces occupy Tanga, (German East Africa). Mr David Lloyd George becomes Sec. of State for War.
10th	German commercial submarine arrives in Norfolk.
11th	Seaham harbour (on the coast of Durham) shelled by German sub.
14th	Battle of Bazentin Ridge begins-ends 17th July.
15th	Battle of Delville Wood begins.
19th	Battle of Fromelles (19th/20th).
23rd	Battle of Pozieres Ridge begins.
30th	First aerial operations by combined French & British Air Services on Western Front.

The Battle of Verdun was continuing: ended 20/12/1916

The Somme: 1July - 18 November.

This has become a symbol of the war on the Western Front: massed ranks of inexperienced soldiers rising out of their trenches to be mown down by machine gun or blown apart by artillery. It involved 12 separate battles, the first four beginning in July.

1,732,873 shells were used in the preliminary bombardment. 30% of British shells in the pre-battle bombardment failed to explode.

At 7.28a.m. on the first day of the battle, the British detonated two large mines near the village of La Boisselle. the Lochnagar mine was the bigger of the two (60,000 pounds of explosives against the 40,000 pounds in Y Sap). Royal Flying Corps pilot, Lieutenant Cecil A. Lewis, that the column of earth reached 4,000 feet in height.

Despite the explosions, and the week-long bombardment, the Germans' deeply dug defences and barbed wire were left mainly intact. They had heard the British tunnelling and moved their machine gun positions accordingly.

Of the Leeds Pals battalion on the first day, 248 were killed, 267 were wounded and 181 were listed as missing: 47 were uninjured!

19,240 British Army soldiers killed on the first day of the battle. It remains the highest death toll for a single day's combat. Of the 120.000 that launched the attack, almost half became casualties. **Rosemary Moss**

NO TIME TO LOOSE

(Luke Ch. 9 v 51-62)

Do you not find when listening to your local radio station the presenter lets us know what the current time is two or three times. In an average day how many times do you check the time either by looking at you watch or mobile phone?

Jesus had neither watch or radio, but all through his ministry he had a strong sense of living by God's timetable. He took care to avoid provoking his arrest before the time was right. Though he often wore himself out teaching and healing, he refused to let others dictate what he did and when.

In the same way, Jesus expects us to realise that our commitment to him is costly and urgent. In quick succession Luke shows three would be followers in conversation with Jesus. One wanted commitment on more comfortable terms. One used his family obligations to delay his discipleship. The third had an apparently reasonable request, but Jesus seems to have seen split loyalties that were holding him back. None of these half-hearted disciples would be used in God's Kingdom.

Knowing that this same Jesus call us to follow him prompts a question. What time is it for us? How can we be of most use in God's Kingdom today? Please answer and don't delay
