
Included are links to YouTube hymns, which have the words included (just click the links in blue).



Introduction to our service

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, during Lent we have been preparing by works of love and self-sacrifice for the celebration of our Lord's death and resurrection. Today we come in our own homes but spiritually together to begin this solemn celebration in union with the Church throughout the world. Christ enters his own city to complete his work as our Saviour, to suffer, to die, and to rise again. Let us go with him in faith and love, so that, united with him in his sufferings, we may share his risen life.

If you have made a palm cross or have one from last year hold up palms while you pray this prayer, or use the photograph:



God our Saviour, whose Son Jesus Christ entered Jerusalem as Messiah to suffer and to die; let the palms be for us signs of his victory and grant that we who bear them in his name may ever hail him as our King, and follow him in the way that leads to eternal life; who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

The Palm Gospel

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark.

Glory to you, O Lord.

When they were approaching Jerusalem, at Bethphage and Bethany, near the Mount of Olives, he sent two of his disciples and said to them, 'Go into the village ahead of you, and immediately as you enter it, you will find tied there a colt that has never been ridden; untie it and bring it. If anyone says to you, "Why are you doing this?" just say this, "The Lord needs it and will send it back here immediately." They went away and found a colt tied near a door, outside in the street.

As they were untying it, some of the bystanders said to them, 'What are you doing, untying the colt?' They told them what Jesus had said; and they allowed them to take it. Then they brought the colt to Jesus and threw their cloaks on it; and he sat on it. Many people spread their cloaks on the road, and others spread leafy branches that they had cut in the fields. Then those who went ahead and those who followed were shouting,

'Hosanna!

Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord! Blessed is the coming kingdom of our ancestor David! Hosanna in the highest heaven!'

Then he entered Jerusalem and went into the temple; and when he had looked around at everything, as it was already late, he went out to Bethany with the twelve.

Mark 11:1-11

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

Praise to you, O Christ.

The Collect

Take a moment of silence, before you pray:

Almighty and everlasting God, who in your tender love towards the human race sent your Son our Saviour Jesus Christ to take upon him our flesh and to suffer death upon the cross:

grant that we may follow the example of his patience and humility, and also be made partakers of his resurrection;

through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

Read the readings from this week's sheet; try reading them out aloud.

At the end of each you may say: This is the word of the Lord; thanks be to God.

This is the Passion of the Lord.

A reflection from Guy - Palm Sunday, the beginning of Holy Week 2020.

Holy Week is about listening to God, the priority for all Christians. Judas betrayed Jesus, Peter denied him, and the rest deserted him.

The crowds turned on him.

As we go through these difficult days this year we cannot be gathered together, as in previous years, but let's again affirm our commitment to listen to God and to build up the relationships between us as those who are disciples of Jesus Christ.

This year through many telephone calls and other communication methods which some of us had never heard of before, we are building the church in a new way.

The normal and various signs and powerful actions of this week; the Renewal of Ordination vows and the Blessing of the Oils usually on Maundy Thursday, cannot happen;

The foot washing and stripping of the altars on Maundy Thursday evening; the starkness of the bare church on Good Friday; cannot happen.

But in this enforced separation, let's take this time as the gift of retreat from normality and focus on God and all He has done for us.

The waiting and dead silence of Holy Saturday; this can happen in our homes.

And the sheer joy on Easter Day; lets allow this to happen, and lets allow the love, joy, hope and power of the resurrection flow through and from us!!

Let's take this situation as an opportunity to renew our trust, ensure we are open and honest to God and one another and commit ourselves with renewed energy to respond to the Good News.

Christ is alive and so we can proclaim the gospel afresh confidently in this generation. It is the wisdom of God, the power of God for salvation. **Amen**.

For those who make laws, interpret them, and administer them, that our common life may be ordered in justice and mercy.

For our Government and all whose decisions effect the lives of others, that they may know you guidance and wisdom and may their decisions be just and for the good and health of all, let us pray to the Lord

Lord, have mercy.

For those who still make Jerusalem a battleground, let us pray to the Lord.

Lord, have mercy.

For those who have the courage and honesty to work openly for justice and peace.

For our NHS and all care workers and essential workers, for all who serve us in any way at this time, let us pray to the Lord.

Lord, have mercy.

For those in the darkness and agony of isolation, that they may find support and encouragement, let us pray to the Lord.

Lord, have mercy.

For those who are unwell, for those who are grieving, for those weighed down with hardship, anxiety, failure, or sorrow, that they may feel that God is very close them, let us pray to the Lord.

Lord, have mercy.

For those who are tempted to give up the way of the cross, let us pray to the Lord.

Lord, have mercy.

That we, with those who have died in faith, may find mercy in the day of Christ, let us pray to the Lord.

Lord, have mercy.

Holy God, holy and strong, holy and immortal, have mercy upon us.

Jesus taught us to call God our Father, so we have courage to say:

Our Father in heaven,
hallowed be your name,
your Kingdom come,
your will be done,
on earth as in heaven.
Give us today our daily bread.
Forgive us our sins
as we forgive those who sin against us.
Lead us not into temptation
but deliver us from evil.
For the kingdom, the power,
and the glory are yours,
now and forever.
Amen.
